This event has been organised by the Diocesan Youth and Children's Officer for St Andrews's Dunkeld and Dunblane, on behalf of the PYC. The event itself will be led by PYC leaders, all of who are PVG checked. This event is a social get-together for young people across the province aged 12-18 years (at secondary school or of secondary school age). We are very grateful to the Rector and Vestry of St Johns, Dumfries for agreeing to host this event. St Johns facilities include a hall, a kitchen and bathrooms, these are designated Ladies and Gents. The young people will sleep 'dormitory style' in the hall with girls on one side, boys on the other and leaders in the middle. There will be games and activities on Saturday after arrival. The young people have been invited to lead part of the worship on the Sunday morning. This is an exciting chance to devise their own creative worship. This event includes a Saturday evening meal and Sunday breakfast.

HOW TO GET THERE BY:

• CAR from Edinburgh

Take the 90 to J10 and follow the A912 into Perth, Follow the road you will come to an roundabout, go straight on with TESCO on your right hand side. Past the Skoda garage and Prison, and you will see the South inch on either side of you. At the Traffic Lights Princes Street is straight on, the church is on the right at the next set of lights. There is on street parking and side street parking, near to the Church. If staying for a long time, there is a multistore car park diagonally across, which is Canal Street car park. 15 minutes is free.

Car from Inverness

At Broxden roundabout take the M90 towards Edinburgh and follow Signs for Coupar Angus. Once you join the road after a slight descent to the left, after the bridge take the A85 to Perth.

Once in Perth at the lights with Stonehouse and Travelodge on your right turn left over the Queens bridge, and turn left, then right at the lights. At the next set of lights, you join Princes Street and the Church is next to the car park on the left hand side next to the church. Up to 15 minutes is free, but you need a free ticket.

Car from Stirling

At Broxden Roundabout at the top of the A9 Follow directions for cars from Inverness.

Car from Dundee

On the A90 take the slip road A85 to Perth and follow road into Perth and Follow directions as the same from Inverness.

TRAIN

Perth train Station is a short walk to St Johns. When leaving the Station turn right and follow the Road under the Bridge and down to the cross roads, controlled by lights. Turn Left into Princes Street and church is near the lights on the right hand side. A Walking Bus can be arranged if more than one-person traveling by train around the same time.
