EMERGENCY PRAYER – introducing the new Prayer Chain Co-ordinator

Recently you will have heard that I have taken over managing the Mother's Union Diocesan Prayer Chain. As I haven't been in the Diocese very long, I thought I should introduce myself and, at the same time, remind people about the Prayer Chain and how it works.

I moved to Dalgety Bay in 2019 to be near my son and his family – I have three small granddaughters. In view of what has happened since it was a good decision! Until then, apart from my student years in Birmingham, I had spent my whole life in Gloucestershire and the Gloucester Diocese. Some of you will remember Pat Harris who was the Central President back in the 1990s. Her husband was the Vicar of the parish in which I worshipped. Her strong-arm tactics meant that everyone who worshipped there became MU members. The fact that I was a single parent, worked full-time and would be unable to attend meetings was not considered an adequate excuse. I joined! Our then local (male) MP who lived and worshipped in the parish also joined! When my son became older, I was able to attend meetings and become involved at Diocesan level and took various

roles. When I moved to Dalgety Bay I began worshipping at Holy Trinity, Dunfermline where everyone was so welcoming. I have happily made my new spiritual home there.

On hearing that someone was needed to take over the Prayer Chain I realised that this was something I could easily do from home, so I volunteered. The Prayer

Chain in Gloucester Diocese used to operate by telephone. There was a list of names and when one received a phone call one then passed the message to the next person on the list. The coming of the internet and email made things so much easier and efficient and, like in this Diocese, everything is now done that way.



For those who don't know about the Prayer Chain the principle is that a number of members have agreed to pray for anyone or any issue referred to them. WE ARE DELIGHTED TO WELCOME....

My name is Jodie Taylor and I have just moved up from the Diocese of Llandaff in South Wales to Dunblane where my son now lives. I have been member of MU for many years holding a variety of

offices during that time. My six years as VP came to an end just as I moved but I also handed over the mantle of both branch and deanery leader.

When I retired 13 years ago I volunteered (as a MU member) in the local prison, there were about 20 MU members volunteering at that time along with some WI ladies. Parc prison, Bridgend is quite a large men's prison holding approximately 2000 inmates and volunteers helped in the play area. The play area was a specially dedicated corner of the visits hall with a play house built by the prisoners, tables and chairs for crafts and a small soft play area for the younger visitors. On her visit to Wales, I was allowed to show Sheran Harper our Worldwide President around the visits area where I worked and introduce her to wardens I worked with, she was amazed at both the facilities and the work done for both the prisoners and families talking about it at the annual meeting in Portsmouth. During that time I have been very lucky to have been granted vouchers from the Toy Retailers Association to be spent on toys at the nearest Entertainer shop, and in January I took my last car load of toys to the prison (to the value of £500), which over the years brought the grand total I had been given to £5000 worth of toys donated to the prison.



During lockdown the play area had been redecorated and at my farewell I was asked if I would be willing for the play area to be named after me, what greater honour could I have just for doing something I loved doing.

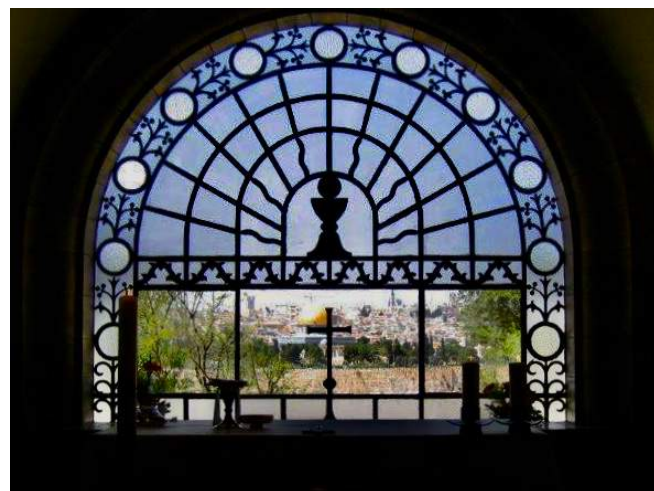
