A MESSAGE FROM REVD. ELAINE GARMAN



MUSIC AND SPIRITUALITY: THE COVID-19 EFFECT

The Covid-19 pandemic and its accompanying restrictions presented a change in worship music as in-person worship was limited for months. In Scotland, church services were completely shut down; and even when churches re-opened, most church-goers were not allowed to sing for a time. I am curious to know the relationship between your musical and your spiritual experiences, and how these were affected by these restrictions.

Please take part in The Covid-19 Effect survey, which should take no more than 5-10 minutes to complete. Your responses will help me and my research team to understand the effects of music in worship on people's spirituality or, more specifically, the effects of being prevented from participating in the music in in-person worship. We hope to use the results from this survey to develop informed resources for faith communities to meet their spiritual needs.

The research project is led by Prof. George Corbett and Dr Sarah Moerman.
