Youth Fellowship of St. Church, Elgin Road, organized a Workshop on Mental Health on 7.5.23 in their church. 147 excited young people of our diocese took part. The Rt. Revd. Dr. Paritosh Canning our Bishop, speaking to them, took the example of the mental health of the man who had been lying near the pool of Bethesda for 38 years. After facing so much of failure the man had become discouraged, disillusioned and lost hope. But Jesus asked him, "Do you want to get well?" and told him to get up, pick his mat and walk. At once, the man was cured and picked up his mat and walk. Resource papers were also presented by Ms. Sutapa Chatterjee, and by Rev. Dr. Amos Masih of Bishop's College. We thank the Youth Fellowship of St. Mary's Church for taking the initiative to organize such an endeavor on their own and inviting other church youths also to take part. May this venture inspire the youth of other churches to launch out on their own to reach young people who are not coming to church.

Prayers are requested among others for the Meitei Christians whose churches schools and homes have been burnt down and have been forced to renounce their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.
