WILLIAM OF PERTH

Today, 23rd May, is the Feast Day of St William of Perth, one of my favourite saints. He lived in the late 12th century, 100 years before Robert the Bruce. William was a baker in Perth, and as a faithful Christian gave one in ten of his loaves each day to the poor. Finding a child

abandoned outside the church, William adopted and raised him. In 1201 William, with the now grown child, set off on pilgrimage to the Holy Land, but outside Rochester, on the way to Canterbury, he was robbed and murdered by the young man. His body was buried at Rochester, and people were drawn to pray there and there were healings and other miracles. William was canonised in 1254, and his shrine can still be found in Rochester Cathedral.

You may ask what this medieval story has to do with us? William represents an ordinary lay Christian, trying to live as a disciple of Jesus Christ in a world that was uncertain, sometimes violent, and often cruel. By his generous giving and his care for the poor, he can still show us how to follow Christ in today's world. The betrayal and violence that led to his death were one result of that kindness, but even in death his memory and his prayers continued to to good and witness to the love that can overcome even death.

Please remember William of Perth today, and celebrate one of God's humble saints.

I hope that a service of Re-Dedication will take place on the anniversary of St Columba's original dedication in 1898, 18th August. I will confirm this nearer the time. As I reported, St Columba's has no reserves or funds of its own, and the renewal is being funded by Provincial and other grants and by the Diocese. But some more support is needed.

I am asking every congregation to consider making a financial donation to the Diocese for St Columba's. Whether your charge can afford £500.00 or £25.00, your gift will help us to re-open the church for worship and begin to serve the growing community with a growing church.
